In the event of Fire (Contd) Hearing the fire alarm (caretaker actions)	ActionProceed where possible to the fire alarm control panel and check the zone in order to indicate the seat of the fire. Proceed to the zone indicated in order to ascertain whether or not the fire is real / false (where ever possible maintain a relative safe distance from the fire by remaining on the safe side of a suitable communal fire door).If a fire is observed call the fire and rescue service immediately.If it is deemed that the fire is emanating from a private dwelling then if it is safe to do so attempt to offer assistance in evacuation. If
	If possible collect any documentation that may assist the fire and rescue service (e.g. building plans identifying layout, service rooms and position of active and passive fire defences, visitors signing in book). Collect information on residents who may require additional help in
	evacuation and wait at the entrance of the building in order to brief the fire service on their arrival.
How will the emergency services be notified and who is responsible	The person finding the fire will dial 999 or 112. When the operator answers, give your telephone number and ask for FIRE. When the fire service replies give the address where the fire is. Do not end the call until the fire service has repeated the address correctly.
Arrangements for the safe evacuation of people identified as being especially at risk	Details of any individuals with special needs maybe displayed near the entrance for easy identification by the emergency services.
Plans to deal with persons once they have left the premises	All evacuated individuals should remain at the assembly point. No individual should re-enter the building for any reason until they have been instructed to do so.
